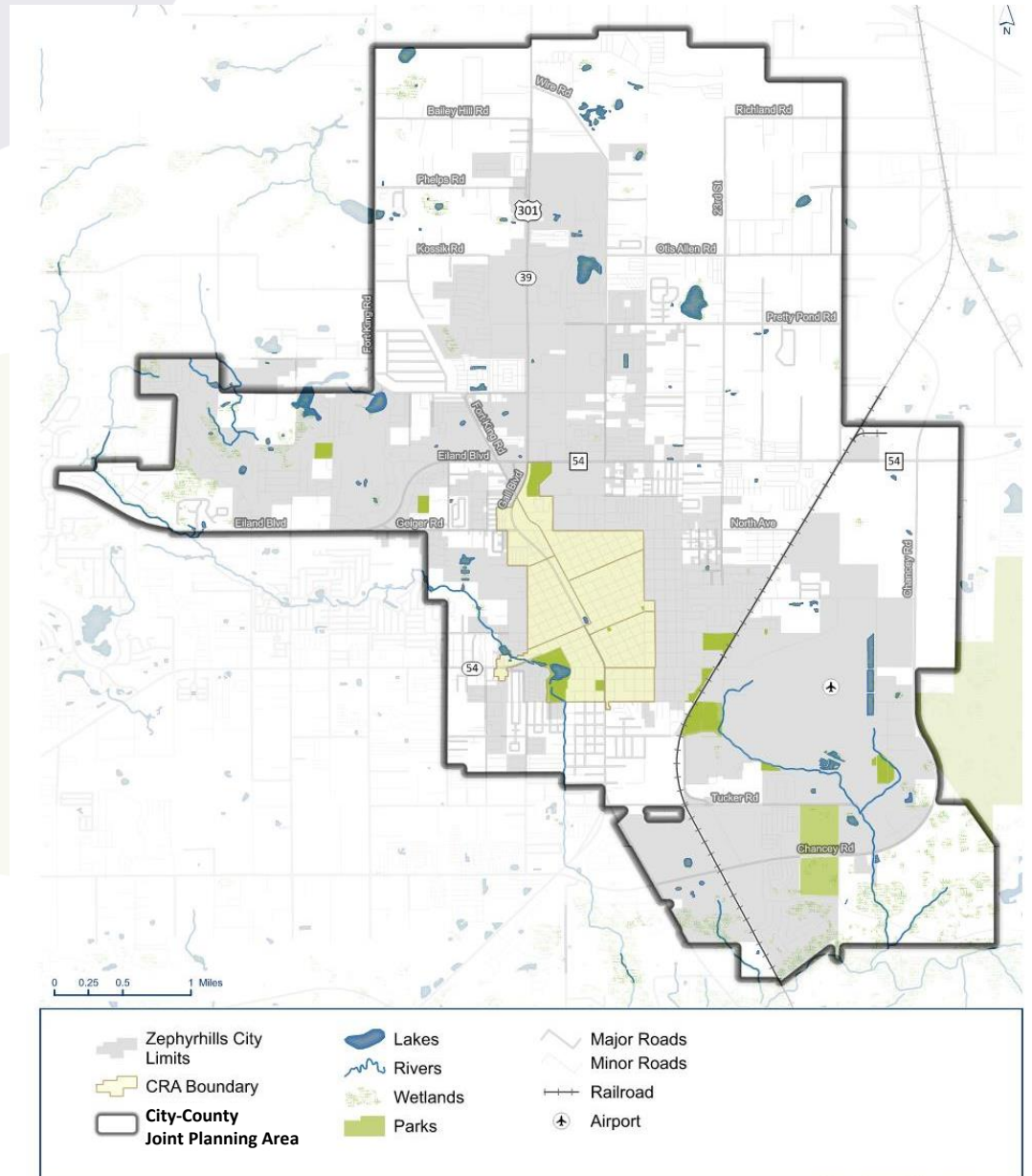

Mobility Plan Overview

Mobility Plan Update

The GoingPLACES Mobility Plan will play a pivotal role in the update of the **city's comprehensive plan**, ensuring our transportation landscape is aligned with the **community's broader vision for growth, development, and place making.**



Study Objectives

- **Enhance accessibility** so all community members have access to safe, reliable, and affordable transportation options.
- Advance transportation solutions that **reduce environmental impact** and **support a healthier city**.
- **Support the local economy** through transportation investments that stimulate economic development and job creation.
- Strengthen the fabric of our community by making it **easier for people to connect with places, services, and each other**

Draft Mobility Strategies

Mobility Plan Strategies

- **Strategy 1:** Enhance access to safe, reliable, convenient, and affordable transportation options for all community members.
 - Improve mobility with job centers and key community destinations.
 - Enhance accessibility and comfort at public transit stops.
 - Collaborate with communities to develop solutions with established neighborhoods.

Mobility Plan Strategies

- **Strategy 2:** Advance transportation solutions that reduce environmental impact and support a healthier community.
 - Construct sidewalk, bicycle lanes and trail in strategic locations.
 - Install bike racks in convenient locations at community destinations.
 - Explore opportunities to expand the use of low-speed, nonmotorized vehicles.

Mobility Plan Strategies

- **Strategy 3**: Prioritize strategic transportation investments aimed at stimulating economic growth and job creation.
 - Upgrade transportation system to provide reliable access to markets from the Zephyrhills Industrial Corridor.
 - Develop Complete Streets improvements within the Community Redevelopment Area.
 - Partner with county and regional agencies to develop the regional bypass loop road.

Mobility Plan Strategies

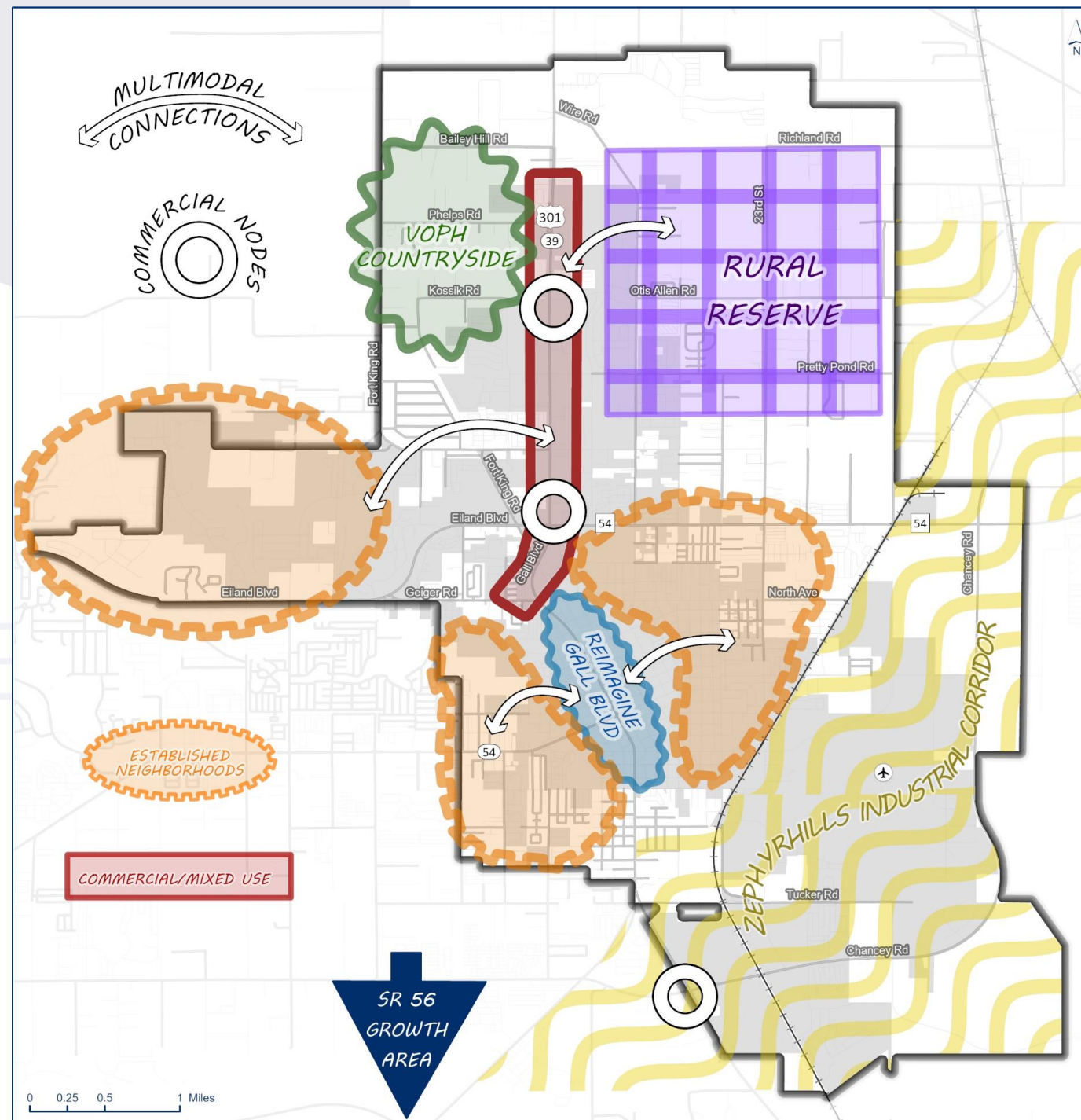
- **Strategy 4:** Use transportation projects as opportunities to enhance the character, identity, and functionality of diverse place types within our city.
 - Establish connectivity standards for new developments to create walking and cycling connections between residential and other destinations.
 - Engage with communities to identify priorities and preferences that reflect the unique character of each.



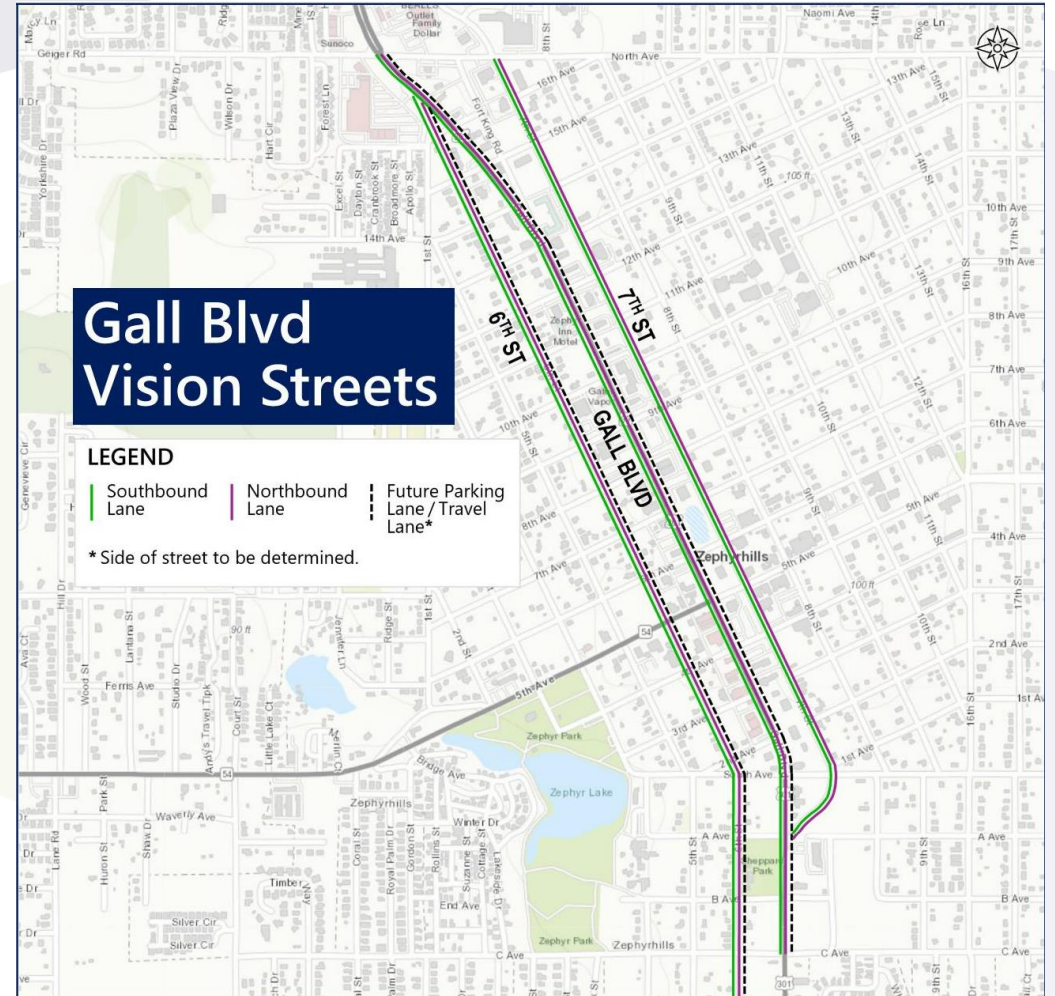
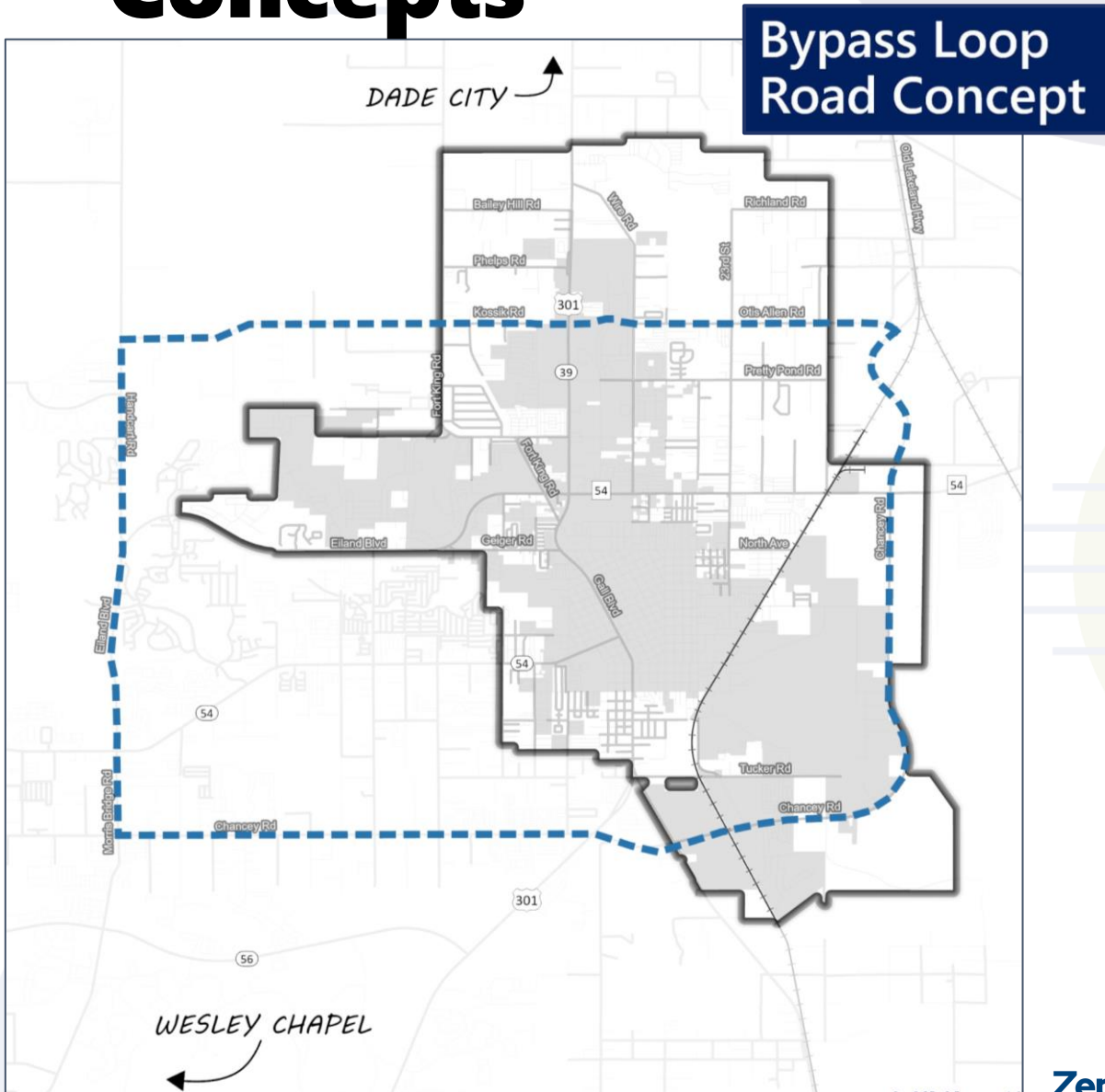
Draft Mobility Concepts

Mobility Plan Concepts / Context

- Address mobility for each distinct area:
 - Existing Neighborhoods.
 - Community Redevelopment Area (US 301 / Gall Boulevard).
 - Commercial / Mixed Use
 - Commercial Nodes
 - Zephyrhills Industrial Corridor
 - Rural Reserve
 - Village of Pasadena Hills Countryside
 - SR 56 Growth Area

Bicycle / Pedestrian Safety Design Elements

- Add mid-block crossings with enhanced crosswalk markings and driver awareness beacons where appropriate.
- Lower posted speed limits to 35 mph.
- Enhance street lighting at crosswalks to improve visibility.
- Install sidewalks to connect with nearby transit stops.



Concept: Pedestrian Crossing on SR 54 east of Court Street

Freight Design Considerations

- Optimize intersection operational efficiency.
- Balance truck movement needs with pedestrian refuge and safety.
- Design left turn lanes to accommodate large truck turning radius.
- Extend turn lanes to provide additional storage for trucks.

Freight Oriented Area

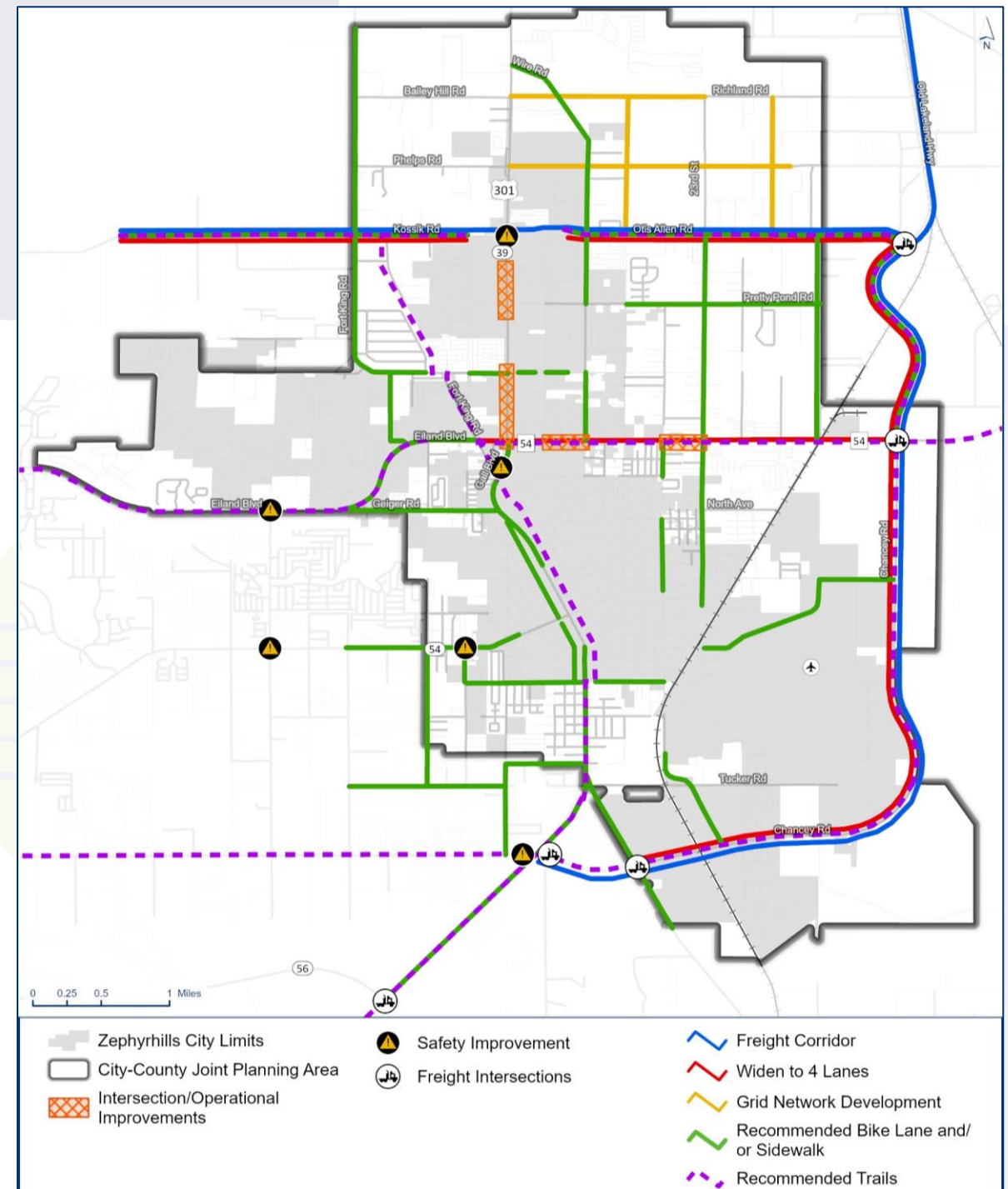

Mobility Plan Recommendations

- Advance safety and complete streets concepts.
- Add regional trail network connectivity
- Address gaps in bicycle and pedestrian networks.
- Relieve congestion and roadway capacity.
- Improve freight access and roadway compatibility.

Timeline / Next Steps

- Phase 1 January – February
 - Project initiation and discovery
 - Identify mobility issues and existing conditions
- Phase 2 February – April
 - Develop a mobility needs assessment
 - Strategies and recommendations for consideration in Future Land Use Plan
 - Prepare illustrative concept maps to communicate the Mobility Plan
- Phase 3 April – June 
 - Prepare draft documentation for public review
 - Present recommendations to Planning Commission and City Council.
